Range Rules

1. Only Black Powder & Black Powder Substitute, muzzle-loading and Cap & Ball firearms shall be fired on the club range. Failure to comply with this rule will result in suspension and removal from the range.
2. The term Black Powder, Blackpowder, and Black Powder Substitute are always interchangeable.
3. All NMLRA Rules apply, unless superseded by club rules.
4. The Loading Area is considered to be at the area past the cable. The firing line is defined by the wooden ties on the front edge of the covered range and the rope on the primitive range.
5. Anyone under 18 (eighteen) years of age must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian at all times while on the firing line.
6. All juniors must have an adult load the firearm for them or have constant adult supervision if old enough to load on their own.
7. No loaded firearms of any type shall be handled, displayed or shown, demonstrated, or traded except on the firing line with the muzzle pointed toward the bunker so that a discharge would place a projectile into the bunkers.
8. No firearm shall be handled, loaded, capped or primed except during a relay. (Range is hot)
9. Firearms should always be carried with muzzle up.
10. Firearms should only be capped or primed with muzzle pointed down range into the berm when the range is hot.
11. Once a firearm is capped or primed it should never be pointed higher than the berm.
12. There will be NO blowing down the barrel of any firearm per NMLRA Rules
13. No cartridge black powder firearm, modern firearm, or BB gun(s) shall be fired on range property. This is a black powder, muzzle loading only club.
14. No target shall be fired upon unless said target is in line with the bunkers, attached to a target frame, and placed so that the projectile will strike said bunker.
15. No foreign matter, such as rocks, cans or bottles, shall be fired upon. Unless during a club sponsored match including but not limited to NMLRA Territorial Primitive Match, Scrap Iron Shoots, and Novelty Shoots.
16. No intoxicating beverages or intoxicated persons shall be allowed in the loading area or on the firing line. No exceptions.
17. No smoking shall be allowed in the loading area or firing line. No exception.
18. No children shall be allowed on the firing line without adult supervision. No exception.
19. No pets shall be allowed on the firing line. No exceptions.
20. No one may be at or near the lakes without the land owner's & club's written permission.
21. Any shooter firing a flintlock gun shall warn shooters on either or both sides before firing said gun.
22. No open containers of powder shall be allowed in the loading area or on firing line. No exceptions.
23. Any electrical cord used at the range should be a three-prong cord.

Match Rules

1. National Muzzle Loading Rifle Association rules shall govern unless stated otherwise by the club.
2. The notch on open sights must be mounted forward of the breech of the barrel on rifles and muskets.
3. Any metallic sights can be shot in matches, but only open sights qualify for daily and winning aggregate scores. Unless otherwise posted or noted.
4. Standard pistol targets will be used for all pistol matches unless otherwise stated by the Club.
5. Firearms, which can be used on our range, are defined as follows:
 - a. Rifle: Any flint or percussion rifle. Either original or a reproduction of same, loading from the muzzle, shooting a round patched ball and backed by black powder. Original or reproduction of period (Pre-1840) correct air rifles using lead pellets or round ball.
 - b. Pistol: Any flint or percussion single shot pistol, either original or a reproduction of same, loading from the muzzle, shooting a round patched ball and backed by black powder, or any percussion revolver, either original or a reproduction of same, loading from the front and shooting either a round or conical lead ball, as specified by the matchmakers, shall be legal.
 - c. Musket: Any flint or percussion military rifle or musket .54 caliber or larger, either original or reproduction of same, loading from the muzzle and shooting a Minnie or round ball backed by black powder, shall be legal.
 - d. Shotgun: Any flint or percussion shotgun either original or a reproduction of same, loading from the muzzle, shooting shot no larger than no. 7 1/2 and backed by black powder, shall be legal.
 - e. Conversions: The safety committee must first inspect any modern firearm converted to a muzzle-loading firearm. Their findings shall then be determined whether or not the piece will be accepted on the range.
6. In case of a score protest, the person protesting a score must see the president who will check with the scorekeepers and have them recheck the score. The Scorekeepers will then render a decision. The president will then notify the person protesting of their decision. The scorekeepers' decision is final.
